Making it Simple

Simplified Pricing

Washington & Jefferson College has revised and reduced its published tuition price beginning Fall 2023 to more clearly reflect the actual amount our students now pay for tuition.

Why reduce the published tuition price?

Washington & Jefferson College is a changemaker! Taking a bold approach to simplifying the cost to attend college will benefit both our students and the College.

- 1 Make W&J clearly attainable for students from all backgrounds.**
Historically, the College's published price may have discouraged potential students from considering a quality institution like Washington & Jefferson. Our new tuition price makes it apparent to all prospective students that W&J is an excellent option for them!
- 2 Make the cost of attendance simple.**
No W&J student pays more tuition than the new published tuition price. We are making the cost straightforward. Incoming students will know their cost of attendance earlier in their admissions process.
- 3 W&J is taking the lead on an uncommon pricing model.**
W&J has long been recognized in higher ed rankings by U.S. News & World Report as a "Best Value" institution because of excellent outcomes from students who pay a fair price. We are taking the lead to be responsive to cost-conscious families and the national conversation on college pricing and affordability.

How does this affect current students?


W&J students already pay less tuition than the new, published tuition price. We are pleased that there will be no increase in tuition for the 2nd consecutive year. The tuition price reduction will not impact any student's bottom-line cost of attendance unless there are changes to a family's financial situation or changes to room and board costs or selections. Students will continue to receive their awards and other funding scaled to the new tuition price.
